- Hidden Lakes Ranch is located in game management unit (GMU) 140.
- The Colorado Park and Wildlife department has a landowner tag program called the Landowner Preference Program.
- The Landowner Preference Program (LPP) gives a preference for hunting licenses (tags) to land owners.
- There is no fee to submit a registration for the Landowner Preference Program. Registrations are valid for up to five (5) years. The landowner must submit a registration online at 'Colorado LPP Registration'.
- The registration deadline is December 1 to be eligible for the draw the following year (e.g., December 1, 2016, for the 2017 hunting draw).
- If the land is deeded under different legal entities, a separate registration is required for each legal entity.
- Registered landowners for the LPP will receive a specific number of applications based upon the number of deeded acres owned and properly registered.
- Landowner Preference Program applications are drawn just before public limited drawing. Successful landowners will receive a voucher for each winning hunt code per application. Landowners will be notified at the same time as public applicants.
- The voucher must be transferred from the landowner, or the designated land manager, directly to the individual to be used by that individual for the purchase of a license.
- There are no landowner tags for turkey hunts. The tags are either drawn by the hunter or purchased over the counter in the late season by the hunter.
- Mountain lion tags are purchased over the counter.
- Bear tags are either drawn by the hunter or purchased over the counter in the late season by the hunter.
