Lay of the Land

Rock Tank Ranch is 19 miles north and west of Roswell, New Mexico on Highway 247 and is convenient to the Roswell Municipal Airport. This inspiring property is located in the high desert in southeastern New Mexico grass country. Elevations of Rock Tank Ranch vary from 3,500 to 4,000 feet, providing breathtaking vistas of near and far mountain peaks and valleys. The spectacular Capitan Mountain looks close enough to reach out and touch. Both rugged and rolling landscape stretches out in all directions. Grassy slopes, rocky canyons, steep ravines and the

frequent relief of fields sporting several species of native grasses paint the area with texture and color.

Rock Tank Ranch is only forty minutes from the town of Capitan, New Mexico, which is fast earning a reputation among travelers for its quaint gift and antique shops and variety of restaurants. Just a few minutes from Capitan lies the village of Ruidoso, nationally renowned for its skiing, fine dining and shopping, as well as being home to the world-famous Inn of the Mountain Gods Resort and Casino.

Local wildlife at Rock Tank Ranch includes deer, coyote, bobcat and antelope.

The mild climate allows establishment of many types of flowering plants, perennials and vines throughout the compound. Vast grazing land features native grasses and characteristics of the merging Chihuanhan Desert where the occasional cactus and yucca will thrive.

Climate

Summer heat can be extreme in high desert, which is typically hot with abundant sunshine. Year-round temperatures are mostly comfortable; winters are not severe and snow is often a fun event. Skies are mostly clear with brilliant night skies. Sunrise and sunset are colorful and majestic a perfect setting you will want to share with your family.

Thunderous midsummer storms provide most of the precipitation with the annual average around 16 inches. The growing season is an ample 190 days.

Rock Tank is a livestock grazing facility with a number of potential features. Affordable carrying cost and a wonderful place to raise a family are only a few. Its close proximity to town offers the flexibility of public school usage and shopping as well as additional employment.
